

A Letter From The Pastor...





Fourth Sunday of Advent and Star Wars!

After dinner I have this habit of sitting in the recliner with my computer on my lap and the TV in front of me. The computer is to go through my emails or continue some office work not yet finished and the TV is simply for entertainment.

I scroll through *xfinity*'s TV guide trying to find something that I might enjoy. I have figured out how to set up my "favorite" channels so I don't have to scroll through all 2000 of them - or whatever crazy number it is. Now I only have a few hundred from which to choose. More often than not I scroll through and don't find anything that I really want to watch. "Let me scroll through one more time," I say to myself. Off I go, back to channel 2 and zip through for a second pass. Nothing. Truth be told, I usually end up landing on something that I've already seen.

Of late, one of the channels has been having a Star Wars marathon. The original Star Wars series [1977, 1980, 1983] have always been one of my favorite series of movies so I indulged and spent a few hours with Obi Wan Kenobi, Princess Leia, Luke Skywalker, and Darth Vader.

This futuristic, intergalactic drama is filled with flashy graphics. Perhaps that is one of the reasons why I enjoy watching it, but if I dig a bit deeper, one of the reasons it speaks to me is because the story is the basic story of good vs evil, dark vs light ... and the good always wins. There is no doubt that the technological imagination added a unique telling of this story [at least it was unique in 1977!] but the message is that timeless storyline of the challenge for the good.

In life we face challenges all the time. We are forced to make choices, and those choices are always filtered through the many things going on in our life at that specific time. So in addition to the battle for what is good, these primal stories also include forgiveness, rebirth, new life, and hope.

Star Wars is from "A long time ago, in a galaxy far, far away..." and the scriptures that tell our stories of good vs evil, light vs dark, were literally written a long, long time ago, yet the stories still speak to us because the stories are our stories, today.

In the first reading from the Book of Micah, we hear that our savior is going to come from this small forgotten place, so small that it doesn't even count among the clans of Judah. Yet, the Shepherd will come and lead us, and He shall be peace.

The two main characters of the Star Wars saga are Luke Skywalker and Princess Leia. These reunited siblings, born of special lineage, both chose to pursue the good. Despite all the challenges that confronted them, the self-doubts, the personal struggles, they continued to follow the good. In the end they were victorious.

We might think that we keep flipping through the channels of our life but we too will be victorious if we continue "to believe that what was spoken to us by the Lord would be fulfilled."

May God continue to bless you and may the force be with you!

Weekly Reflections...



We celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent today. We have a longer Advent season this year; sometimes Christmas is a day or two after the 4th Sunday, but not this year.

Throughout the season of Advent we have

the opportunity to focus on several people from the New Testament who are so important and yet we don't hear that much about some of them: Zechariah, Elizabeth,

Associate John the Baptist and, of course, Joseph and Mary. Although we do not hear much about them, what we hear shows forth people who were attentive to God and showed what this meant to them in challenging circumstances. Zechariah and Elizabeth suffered for years when Elizabeth was not able to get pregnant. John the Baptist had a message that was welcomed by many but was a threat to those in power. Then, Joseph plans on marrying a woman whom he finds out is already pregnant. What an upright man to "do the right thing" by taking Mary as his wife in these circumstances. The little we know about these New Testament persons speaks loudly of how they lived out their faith in God.

This weekend we hear the Gospel story of Mary visiting Elizabeth - one pregnant woman visiting another. The author Kathleen Norris (Give Us This Day, December 19) commenting on this event says: "Although art often shows Mary as fragile, she must have been sturdy and strong to climb those steep Jordan hills. Then as now pregnancy and childbirth are messy and dangerous and these women are risking their lives to give birth to John and Jesus." Up until recently, you would never see a painting or statue of a pregnant Mary or of pregnant Mary and pregnant Elizabeth greeting each other. Thank God for these pregnancies.

All of us - we here at the parish and you in your homes - have days ahead that can be pressured and full of many things. These are days rich with spirit and meaning. Enjoy them. Remember why you are doing what you are doing and say a prayer for your loved ones or friends that you know who may be going through a difficult time. It is not an easy time for many.

Effective January 1, 2022 PAAD and Senior Gold limits will increase by 10,000 each.

This increases the income eligibility limits established in the Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program to \$38,769 for single persons and \$45,270 combined income for married couples. Under the Senior Gold Prescription Discount Program, income eligibility limits are \$10,000 higher than PAAD income eligibility limits. Therefore, the bill will increase income eligibility limits under the Senior Gold Prescription Discount program to \$48,769 for single persons and \$55,270 combined income for married couples. If you need assistance in filling out an application call Senior Services to schedule an appointment (609) 494-8861.

Are you in need of assistance with Dental, Vision, Pharmaceutical and Physicians co-pay cost? We are here to help!
