### Pastoral Staff Letter...



Peace be with you!

Three times in today's gospel the risen Lord addresses us: "Peace be with you". The peace of the risen Jesus is a peace that comforts fears, empowers forgiveness and enables us to accept suffering and death as the doorway to new life. As a Eucharistic community here at St. Francis, we celebrate **Divine Mercy Sunday** and remember those whose lives have ended by suicide.

Some say the death of a loved one by suicide is probably the most traumatic event that can be experienced. Shock, denial, anger, guilt, shame, unbelievable pain and grief are but a few of the emotions that the survivor encounters immediately. There are so many questions, so few answers. Where does one begin? Our faith tells us that we are not left alone to survive this awful experience. God is there in the midst of all the chaos and confusion.

The God of compassion holds the hand of the deceased and gently brings his child to paradise, while the God of love enfolds the survivors of suicide in Trinitarian embrace.

The term "survivor" is used for any person grieving a death by suicide. Most survivors didn't give suicide a second thought until it happened to them. In the past, people didn't talk about suicide or brain illnesses. Suicide has had a long history of being a taboo subject, one that people just don't talk about. There is still a stigma related to suicide, depression and many other types of brain disorders. The topic of suicide is still too uncomfortable for many people. Hopefully that is changing as people who are survivors are coming together to share their feeling, their experiences, and hope for the future

Today's Scriptures tell us that faith begins with a personal encounter with the risen Christ and leads to membership in a community of faith that gives witnesses through concrete actions to the presence of Christ.

This challenge is lived out perhaps as we find ourselves talking to an individual who has lost someone to suicide. Our tendency is to panic or react...what do I say ?...will I make "it" worse? In saying how we feel about the death of another and talking about death, that the process of healing begins. It is here that the presence of the risen Christ is experienced by all. God made us holy and human. Our human senses of seeing, feeling, hearing are doorways to compassion and knowledge. It is in these experiences that we know Jesus is alive and among us. It is in each other that we touch the wounds of Christ and bring healing. At the same time, we come to a greater belief that we are signs of the risen Christ and know that God works in us as we share with each other the risen life within.




