

# A Letter From The Pastor...





Fr. Francis Di Spigno, OFM,

War: What is it good for? Absolutely nothing. Say it again.

This is first line of the song, *War*. I first heard it in 1986 on Bruce Springsteen's *Live 1975-85* album, but it was actually written in 1969 by Norman Whitfield and Barrett Strong and originally sung by The Temptations. It was obviously a statement against the war in Vietnam, but sadly, its message has still not been heard.

On October 4, 1965, the Feast of St. Francis, Pope Paul VI, the first pope to visit and address the assembled nations at the UN urged the world to be peacemakers. He said, "It is enough to recall that the blood of millions, countless unheard-of sufferings, useless massacres and frightening ruins have sanctioned the agreement that unites you with an oath that ought to change the future history of the world: never again war, never again war! It is peace, peace, that has to guide the destiny of the nations of all mankind!"

Pope John Paul II stated before the 2003 war in Iraq that that war "would be a *defeat for humanity* which could not be morally or legally justified."

Last Sunday, in his address while praying the Angelus, Pope Francis, in his continuous appeal for an end to the war in Ukraine, said "In the name of God, I ask: Stop this massacre."

We hear these words against war in every generation, in every decade, because in every generation and in every decade, sadly, there is cause to repeat them again and again and again.

As of the writing of this letter we have not confirmed the time and day, but we will be hosting a "*Prayer for Peace*" here at St. Francis as we pray for the people of Ukraine and the people of Russia, an immediate end to this war in Ukraine, and for an end to all wars, forever.

Once the details are finalized we will get that word out to you as soon as possible. In the meantime, I urge all of us to be peacemakers, to pray for peace, and to pray for the people of Ukraine.

Greetings Parishioners and Friends,

Please let us introduce ourselves – Jennifer and Anthony Mauro, co-chairs of the Synod steering committee. We are honored to have been asked to be part of the Synod of Bishops process, as St. Francis of Assisi Parish has been our spiritual home for more than 15 years.

As you may have heard, Pope Francis has called for a Synod of Bishops to meet in 2023. The overarching objective is for the Church to become a listening Church. For us to listen to each other about our faith journeys.

As part of this process, the Pope wants to hear from as many Catholics (both practicing and drifting) as possible. To that end, our parish is organizing a Spiritual Conversation Campaign. The goal of the campaign is to encourage all parishioners and all baptized Catholics to gather and offer their insights and to encounter one another in prayer and active listening. Questions will be asked, and a synopsis of each conversation will be recorded via notetaking and sent to the Diocese. All participant names will be kept in confidence, and no names will be included in the report. The Diocese will then condense and send this information on to the Vatican.

The questions are as follows:

- 1. What have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the Church?
- 2. Consider the comments from the other participants in the first round. What resonated the most for you?
- 3. Reflecting on our conversation, how might the Holy Spirit be prompting you, and all of us as Church, to improve the ways we are able to journey together?

A group of parish volunteers have been trained as facilitators and notetakers. All parishioners and viewpoints will be welcomed and listened to. Open-mindedness and openheartedness will lead to prayerfulness and a reaffirming spirit within each listening session. We hope for a large number of participants. We also encourage each parishioner who plans on participating to extend an invitation to any family member, friend or acquaintance who may not be actively practicing our faith. It is important that we hear from them. Understand that we will not look to evangelize but will only provide non-judgmental listening. Our prayers will be offered to the Holy Spirit seeking guidance, discernment and support for all shared views, opinions, suggestions and hopes given by each and every active participant.

There will be *two Spiritual Conversation Meetings*, one held on Sunday, March 13, after the 10:00 AM Mass in the Parish Center and another on Saturday, March 26, at 10 AM in the Brant Beach Church Hall. There will also be a Zoom meeting at 7 PM, Wednesday, March 23. To sign up for one of these meetings, or for more information, email synod.stfrancis@gmail.com.

We pray now that the Holy Spirit will help you make the decision to participate and we extend our gratefulness in advance for you doing so.



# Weekly Reflections...



"Father, what made you decide to become a priest?" It is a reasonable question to ask of someone who has committed himself to serve in this now counter cultural way. The answer is, of course, deeply personal; so realize when you ask this question that you are putting someone on the spot. But do not be afraid to ask.

In my mid-teens, I wondered about the priesthood. My reasons now seem

embarrassingly naive, but I suppose that they were early hints of grace. After many twists and turns, I was finally ordained at the hands of a bishop with all the usual fanfare. By then I was already a Franciscan friar. It makes a difference.

Over and over again, in joy and tragedy people renew the call to ordination. They say, "We need you to comfort, heal, celebrate, proclaim, and even prophecy; but especially to pray." In short, they say, "We need you to be our priest." The call and the ordination, therefore, are always fresh and so must be the response. It is often that one of us gets home to the friary from the hospital or from hearing confessions or something else and says, "I am glad that I was there."

The shape of priesthood and my own ministry has kept changing in the forty plus years since I was first ordained. As with any deep commitment we make, I sometimes think, "Nobody ever told me it would be like this!" It is right that I should wonder what it means for the community of the church and for my own journey into God. It is more than I can express, but it has all been good and rich and amazing. And I am happy and grateful that the call to priesthood keeps coming.

Persistent problems with my vocal cords have kept me from celebrating mass and I sit in the congregation. It is a reminder that the ministerial priesthood is rooted in the priesthood of all the baptized. I think St. Francis would think it normal for me to be praying unnoticed in the crowd.

In this season of spiritual renovation, we turn away from sin, from what is not of God, and believe ever more deeply in the gospel. It is a good time for all of us to ask ourselves how God calls us to the life and witness that is ours. God calls you and me again and again. How should we respond?

#### FAMILY FAITH MARCH ACTIVITIES

Catholics celebrate a time in the Church when they follow more closely the way of Jesus. We take up spiritual practices and disciplines that help us identify with Jesus more as we prepare to celebrate Easter.

Our families in the Religious Education program will be reading and discussing scripture, Jesus' practice of prayer and learn what they can do as a family to prepare to journey the forty days. We will think about how we treat others. We will look beyond our own wants and desires. We will pay attention to the needs of others. We will look for some ways we can make changes in our lives to grow closer to God. During this season of Penance we will see that the Church looks simple and plain, little flowers or decorations. The priests wear purple vestments.

The art activity for the 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> grades is to make a Lenten resolution egg. The children will choose something to do to make the world a better place and keep the egg chart to see how they are doing, as well as act out a skit about making choices. Grades 4 and 5 will re-enact the way of the cross.

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade children are working with their parents as they prepare for their First Eucharist. We will celebrate the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on **March 21**<sup>st</sup>.

6<sup>th</sup> grade students/parents Bible study continues with session 6 of the Ascension Press "Encounter" program videos "Exile, Return and Maccabean Revolt", followed by a short review. Student/parent teams will use their Bibles to look up the upcoming Sunday Gospel and take time for a reflection. The Saint lesson is about St. Benedict of Palermo and includes a QR code with a video on his life. The theme for this class is Lent, handouts will include a QR code with a match game on the Stations of the Cross. We will use Loyola Press Art Print #20 an interpretation of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed after the Last Supper. There will be handouts and worksheets for more at home study on Lent.

Grade 7 Confirmation prep I candidates will be completing their candidate book this month. This session will focus on the meaning of Grace in their lives, how the will and actions of the Holy Spirit inspire the use of their gifts.

As Matthew Kelly, author of Decision Point another book used in this class says "Be Bold, Be Catholic".
