Letter from the Pastor First Sunday of Lent March 6, 2022

Fr. Francis Di Spigno, OFM,

Time to Rearrange the Furniture

When I was a child I remember every year I would rearrange the furniture in my bedroom. I did not have much say as to how the rest of the house was arranged and decorated but I had some control over "my space." I would put the bed to a different corner and maybe move the desk and chair so that the room had a whole new look. Of course that also meant that I needed to clean up! I would get rid of things I didn't need any more or would never use. I'm not sure why but I do remember that I found it to be good. It certainly gave me a different perspective on my room but it also gave me a different perspective on life.

As a child I also never really liked Lent. It was always about giving something up. Lent equaled pain and suffering. No more eating in between meals, or no ice cream, or whatever the food of choice was for that year, to recognize that we are in Lent. One year I remember sneaking downstairs to eat an orange so that no one would see me. I didn't quite make the connection of how those acts were connected to why we are asked give alms, pray more, or do penance.

Although my waistline now does not need any more potato chips, ice cream, or that late night snack, I have come to realize that Lent is not a "Catholic Diet Plan." The older I get the more I realize how much control I do not have. I can't stop the war in Ukraine. I can't fix global poverty. I can't stop cancer, dementia, or all the other ailments that we and our loved ones can get. I do, however, have some control over "my space" and I do believe that if I can change "my space" I can at least add something positive to the world. Now, I see Lent as a time to retreat where I look at my life, my relationship with God, and my relationships with others and ask how can I make them all better.

So rather than changing recipes and menus, perhaps it's time to rearrange the furniture in our spiritual house. What can we do that will change things up a bit so we can see differently? What boxes needs to be moved, or what habits need to change, or perhaps started, so we can become more attuned to God's presence in our life. What clutter do we have in our lives that keeps us from seeing God or that keeps God from truly touching us. Can we bring that to the curb this Lent so that we can celebrate the hope in the Resurrection in a new way this year?

I pray that we will all be "filled with the Holy Spirit" and "led by the Spirit" during our forty days of Lent so we can know what truly feeds us, satisfies us, protects us, and gives us life.



Weekly Reflections...



Here we are at the beginning of Lent. Are you a person who "gives up something" or a person who "takes on something" during this season? The question is: why do you do this? Yes, it is Lent and we have always been encouraged to do something, but I think we need to take a few moments to ask ourselves: "How is this going to make me a better Christian? Am I going

committed Christian? "

The Gospel reading for this First Sunday of Lent is the Gospel of the temptations of Christ. It is always interesting to me that Jesus was tempted. As a human, Jesus shows us that we can resist any temptation, big or small, in our lives. Temptations are a choice which, if taken, lead us down a road that leads to nothing positive. Temptations are powerful and may look good in the beginning, but stop and think before you give in. By giving in you may harm vourself and others. Temptations are desires, urges, inclinations that prevent us from achieving what will really help us. Lent is a time when we can come to know our strengths and weaknesses and work on them.

Lent seems to be a long period and it is, but like everything, it can slip away from you unless you become more conscious that it provides marvelous opportunities for your personal growth and happiness. One of the Psalm responses that we will hear during this season is "If today you hear his voice, harden not your heart." The Lord has good things for all of us and Lent can be a good time for us to learn how to listen. Listening with the heart not just your ears, helps us understand others and understanding helps us be more compassionate and less judgmental. Listening from the heart also helps us understand ourselves. Sometimes we wonder "why do I do what I do" and "why do I react so quickly?" It is the Lord who can calm us down and allow us to see our good qualities as well as those that need to be softened. So take advantage of this Lenten season that is filled with many blessings for each of us.

When our in-person parent/child classes resume in February, our classes from grades one to five will be discussing different sacraments. For grade one they will experience a re-enactment of Baptism initiated by our Pastor with a follow up activity. Grade two will talk about the Last Supper, do an art project and watch a video in preparation for First Communion. Grade three is talking about all sacraments and creating a sacrament game. Grade four is talking about Reconciliation and forgiveness. They will be using an activity pamphlet to learn more about the Sacrament. Grade five is preparing for Reconciliation with an examination of conscience activity. There are examples for discussion and a prayer service.

All classes begin at 5:30 PM with temperatures taken and masks worn by all, parents, children and catechists.

6th grade students/parents Bible study will resume with session 4 of the Ascension Press "Encounter" program videos on the Old Testament: Desert Wanderings and Conquest and Judges. Student/parent teams will be using their Bibles for a Bible search as well as looking up the upcoming Sunday Gospel. The Saint lesson is about St. Helena, there is a QR code which contains a very informative video/movie on St. Helena. The Theme for this class is Celebrating Mass with a puzzle activity. There will be handouts and worksheets for more at home study of the Mass.


Our seventh grade families will discuss the question, "If you decided to commit your whole life to doing good what would you do?" Through scripture reading this question will be explored in light of the teachings of Jesus. Continuing with the preparation process for Confirmation the candidates will discover that the Apostles began the Church's public ministry at Pentecost, ritual actions of the Sacrament, ways in which Baptism and Eucharist are connected to Confirmation. The saint lesson will be on Venerable Mother Henriette DeLille. Closing prayer will be the Daily Examen.



Greetings Parishioners and Friends,

Please let us introduce ourselves – Jennifer and Anthony Mauro, co-chairs of the Synod steering committee. We are honored to have been asked to be part of the Synod of Bishops process, as St. Francis of Assisi Parish has been our spiritual home for more than 15 years.

As you may have heard, Pope Francis has called for a Synod of Bishops to meet in 2023. The overarching objective is for the Church to become a listening Church. For us to listen to each other about our faith journeys.

As part of this process, the Pope wants to hear from as many Catholics (both practicing and drifting) as possible. To that end, our parish is organizing a Spiritual Conversation Campaign. The goal of the campaign is to encourage all parishioners and all baptized Catholics to gather and offer their insights and to encounter one another in prayer and active listening. Questions will be asked, and a synopsis of each conversation will be recorded via notetaking and sent to the Diocese. All participant names will be kept in confidence, and no names will be included in the report. The Diocese will then condense and send this information on to the Vatican.

The questions are as follows:

1. What have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the Church?

2.Consider the comments from the other participants in the first round. What resonated the most for you?

3. Reflecting on our conversation, how might the Holy Spirit be prompting you, and all of us as Church, to improve the ways we are able to journey together?

A group of parish volunteers have been trained as facilitators and notetakers. All parishioners and viewpoints will be welcomed and listened to. Open-mindedness and openheartedness will lead to prayerfulness and a reaffirming spirit within each listening session. We hope for a large number of participants. *We also encourage each parishioner who plans on participating to extend an invitation to any family member, friend or acquaintance who may not be actively practicing our faith.* It is important that we hear from them. Understand that we will not look to evangelize but will only provide non-judgmental listening. Our prayers will be offered to the Holy Spirit seeking guidance, discernment and support for all shared views, opinions, suggestions and hopes given by each and every active participant.

There will be *two Spiritual Conversation Meetings*, one held on Sunday, March 13, after the 10:00 AM Mass in the Parish Center and another on Saturday, March 26, at 10 AM in the Brant Beach Church Hall. There will also be a Zoom meeting at 7 PM, Wednesday, March 23. To sign up for one of these meetings, or for more information, email synod.stfrancis@gmail.com.
