

As many of you know, Michele has been singing at St. Francis for over 25 years and has been the Director of Music for a bit more than 20 years. During that time, she has done amazing things with our cantors, choirs, and liturgical music here at St. Francis. I have no doubt that she will bring that same enthusiasm, dedication, and expertise to our entire liturgical life. After a crane hoisted the piano from the third floor of their house, the movers gently placed the new piano next to the organ in St. Francis.

The history of the piano is also quite interesting. Although it was made in Estonia, this piano was originally the concert piano in the Communist Concert Hall in Sofia, Bulgaria. How about that for a turn around? It has gone from communist patriotic songs to Now Thank We All Our God! God is good!

As Divine providence would have it, the piano was used for the first time at St. Francis at Davie Weiner's Funeral Mass of Remembrance this past Friday. Nothing but the best for Davie!

Weddings are performed on Friday or Saturday. Weddings are NOT performed on Sundays, the beach, Memorial Day, Fourth of July or Labor Day weekends.

Are you interested in a deeper relationship with God? Do you experience a desire to pray always? Are you searching for a better understanding of the actions of God's grace in your life?

Spiritual Direction

Spiritual Direction is not about problem solving. It is neither counseling nor therapy. It is about enhancing one's prayer life. Directors help people recognize and respond to God's will in their life experiences. One Director summed up the process this way, "All I do is listen. People already have a spiritual life; they are not starting here. Often they need relief from the pressure that they are not doing the right thing. I help them see the goodness in where they are on their journey, not where they think they're supposed to be." God is the real spiritual director.

The Diocese of Trenton has several training programs called an internship. These are two or three year programs focusing on deepening one's own spiritual life and on learning the dynamics of Spiritual Direction. Upon completion of the program a person receives a Certificate from the Diocese.

Our parish has five certified Spiritual Directors.

March 5 – <u>Second Sunday of Lent</u> Practice deep enjoyment – savor slowly a piece of fine chocolate, a glass of wine, a deep breath.

March 6 – Pray for those most affected by climate change – animal species who lose their habitat.

March 7 – Have you ever mentioned an ecological sin in confession?

March 8 – Pray for those most affected by climate change – children of future generations who will pay the price of our selfishness today.

March 9 – Check your coffee and tea are they Fair Trade Good for workers – Good for Earth.

March 10 – Give a donation to an environmental organization.

March 11 – Include an ecological message, perhaps a quote from Laudato Si' as part of your signature as your E-mail.


