

We all know that at times words are not enough. Sometimes they don't come to us and we just don't know what to say or sometimes words can never truly express what is in our hearts. I found myself in that place when my dad died and I find myself there now in my fee-

ble attempt to say thank you for your overwhelming support, love, and prayers for my dad, my family, and for me. I can honestly say, at the writing of this letter, I have still not opened all of the cards that you have sent.

A friar friend of mine from the Irish province sent me this wonderful meditation on grief by the late Cardinal Basil Hume. I share it with to you, perhaps for those who are also grieving, but as my way of saying thank you for your support and accompanying me, as "love, speaking in silence."

> Grief cannot be shared, for it is mine alone. Grief is a dying within me, a great emptiness. a frightening void. It is loneliness, a sickening sorrow at night, on awakening a terrible dread. Another's words do not help. A reasoned argument explains little for having tried too much. Silence is the best response to another's grief. Not the silence that is a pause in speech, awkward and unwanted. but one that unites heart to heart. Love, speaking in silence, is the way into the void of another's grief. The best of all loves come silently, and slowly too, to soften the pain of grief, and begin to dispel the sadness. It is the love of God, warm and true, which will touch the grieving heart and heal it. *He looks at the grieving person and has pity,* for grief is a great pain. He came among us to learn about grief, and much else too, this Man of Sorrows. He knows. He understands. Grief will yield to peace - in time.

If you sent a card, a text, or an email, a phone call, or prayed a quick prayer for my dad, I am most grateful. From the bottom of my heart I thank you.

# Weekly Reflections...



#### Saints of God, the Lord be with you.

In the musical Baby, two pregnant women, and a woman trying to become pregnant sing a song entitled, "I Want It All." It seems that the young man in today's Gospel according to Mark 10:17-30, has it all in a worldly sense but seems to understand that something is missing in his life. Despite all that he has, and all that he does, he thinks he needs to do more to inherit eternal life. Jesus, in love,

tells him to "give to the poor, and you will have treasures in heaven." The young man went away sad, for he had many possessions. We don't know what happened to him. Perhaps upon reflection he took Jesus' advice, or perhaps he decided to do nothing.

I can't help thinking this is a perfect Gospel to reflect upon after celebrating the life of St. Francis on October 4. Francis of Assis had it all: wealth, popularity, and dreams for himself and his future. He saw himself as a successful knight and would be successful cloth merchant, but was taken as a prisoner of war who had to be ransomed by his father, and then had a prolong illness during which he began to reflect his life. In a dream he heard a voice ask him, "Why are you seeking the servant instead of the Lord?" This caused him to reflect even more deeply...and well I assume you know at least part of the rest of his story.

Both the young man and Francis show us aspects of ourselves. We are all seeking something or someone. Perhaps it is a fulfilling relationship, perhaps it is wealth or fame. But I think if we take the time and look more deeply into our desires we will find that we are also hungering for meaning, for wholeness, for a sense of belonging, and for an identity that is big enough for each of us. Maybe it might be helpful to think of eternal life, not in terms only of longevity but in terms of depth as well. It seems to me that both the young man and Francis were living on the surface. It was encountering the Lord, or hearing the voice in a dream, that invited both of them to go deeper into their hearts and desires.

There is another clue in the Gospel that is, I think, helpful. The young man calls eternal life an inheritance. For isn't an inheritance really a gift? He really doesn't need to do anything. What Jesus is asking him is to do is live as if the gift is already given. Give to the poor as God is giving to you, for you, in God's eyes are poor as well. Live in solidarity with the poor by sharing what you have with them. This is what Francis discovered in his encounter with the leper. By doing this we will be living eternal life in the here and now. By sharing what we have with those who have less we will discover the meaning of our lives, we will become more wholly human, we will belong more and more to our community and parish, and we will be living our Christian identity given to us in baptism.

So this week pray that God gives you more...and then share it.
