Weekly Reflections...



Having read that I have been a priest for fifty years, people have asked me: "What has it been like to be a priest for such a long period of time?" Simply, it has been a blessing from God. For a kid who grew up in a town of 8,000 people and went to public schools, I am humbled that God chose me for this responsibility. I have had great mentors- both Friars and laitybeginning with the Bishop who ordained

me, now deceased Cardinal Joseph Bernadine. What a thoughtful, compassionate, and decent Shepherd he was.

I have had 13 assignments in various parts of the east coast during my 58 years with the Franciscans. Nine of these were after I was ordained and extend from Massachusetts to Florida. Twenty four of those years have been here on LBI: five in Maryland, four in Massachusetts, three in Rhode Island, six in Florida, and nine in New York City. There have been blessings in each place although sometimes I didn't agree with the Provincial at first but later was grateful for being asked to do what he wanted. Thirty eight years of the fifty were in parishes and twelve in Formation houses with our "young Friars." I never thought that I would be involved with the "forming" of our young Friars, but it turned out to be challenging at times and a learning experience at others. I now live with three of my former novices: Fr. Francis, Fr. Scott and Fr. Stephen.

People have asked me: how many weddings I have celebrated, how many Baptisms, how many funerals? A simple answer: quite a few. These have been opportunities to get to know people a little better and to be with them at important times in their lives. I hear frequently from couples that I married thirty or forty years ago. Whenever I go over to St. Mary's Cemetery, I look around and remember so many names that I have known and could tell a story about each. People constantly reflect to me God's goodness and the fact that we are all a little unique.

Now I am a "senior Friar in residence" and daily enjoying "not being in charge" although I am the Guardian at the Friary; this is way of serving my brothers. I have been blessed during these years, challenged, learned much. The kid from Allegany will ever be grateful to God and the Franciscans.



The infant Christ "came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected and cared for and raised by Joseph."

The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God's plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, "God trusted Joseph as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child."

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, "in every situation, Joseph declared his own fiat." His "yes" to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardships and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble." Joseph shows us how to say "yes to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who chosen by God to guide the beginnings of history of redemption. He was the true 'miracle' by which God saves the child and his mother."

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life.

Dear St. Joseph, you who were "able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence", help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.



MEDICARE PART D OPEN ENROLLMENT:

St. Francis Senior Services staff are trained State Health Insurance Program (SHIP) counselors for assistance in Medicare A, B, C or D information. Do you know the difference? Medicare A primarily pays for a stay in the hospital, or a skilled nursing facility, B is for doctor's services and outpatient services such as lab tests, C pays for the Medicare Advantage or managed care alternative to traditional Medicare and D of course is the prescription drug plan. Soon Medicare beneficiaries will once again need to make a decision about their prescription drug coverage. Medicare Part D open enrollment period runs through December 7th. During this time, people with Medicare can sign up for a prescription drug plan or switch their current Medicare Part D plan in order to have the best coverage beginning January of 2020. And yes, it's best to check each year for changes. Open enrollment is also the perfect time to review your Medicare Advantage plan with a SHIP Counselor to be notified of any changes. What if you cannot afford a Medicare Part D plan? There is federal assistance available for people with Medicare who have limited income and resources.
